

# **Trinity Health Foundation**



# COMMUNITY OUTREACH



## **Trinity Parish Nursing**

In its thirty-fourth year, our Parish Nurse Program continued to serve the community with wholistic health services, including many aspects of care, such as emotional and spiritual support, health education and preventive services.

In 2022, 35 churches participated in the Parish Nurse Program, resulting in service to 12,971 people, 241 educational programs with 3,307 participants and 855 support group meetings. Parish Nurses also performed 1,073 blood pressure screenings and 208 screening participants (19%) were referred to physicians.







A grant was awarded from Christian Care and Trinity Health Foundation to continue parish nursing services at the homeless shelter in Rock Island. This allowed for a Parish Nurse to promote wellness, offer blood pressure screenings, foot care, medication education, referrals, and spiritual care to people experiencing homelessness. The staff at the homeless shelter have been delighted to have a dedicated parish nurse at their location and are happy that they were able to find funding for these services. Christian Care hopes to continue the partnership in the future, including providing parish nurse services at its recently opened women's shelter.

## Military & Veteran Services

In 2022, the Quad Cities Community Veterans Engagement Board (CVEB), a military advisory committee co-chaired and facilitated by Trinity, made great strides on their strategic plan. The CVEB worked with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to clarify the VA's Inter-Facility Patient Transfer Directive.

Locally, this allows for greater access to care for Veterans in need of transport to the VA hospital in Iowa City, with transportation arrangements and costs provided by the VA. The CVEB also worked with MetroLINK to provide free bus service to Veterans in the Illinois Quad Cities, improving their access to healthcare, resources, employment and more.






To improve knowledge, services, and understanding of Veteran needs, 80 healthcare and mental health providers received education on military culture, the impact of deployment on the health and wellbeing of Veterans, homecoming and transitioning challenges and ways to provide a better care experience for Veterans across the care continuum. Fifty-five faith-based leaders were similarly educated, with the addition of training on moral injury, the impact on the family, and the role of the faith-based leader.

#### **Volunteer Services**

Our volunteers are an engaged group dedicated to helping provide exceptional health care to the Quad Cities community. Volunteer services strives for a positive and meaningful volunteer experience. Volunteers are included in Friends of Trinity, a group with a mission to support the health system through volunteering and fundraising efforts. Friends of Trinity have donated more than \$4.4M to the hospital since its inception.
