### Allen College Engagement & Salvation Army Partnership (ACE-SAP) Free Medical Clinic

The ACE-SAP Clinic is a partnership with the Salvation Army offering preventative healthcare, while serving as a resource for experiential learning through service. Care is provided as part of a clinical and service learning requirement, by registered nurses who are students in Allen College's nurse practitioner program. The students are supervised by a certified nurse practitioner instructor and provide free care to the uninsured or underinsured.
