WHAT'S AN AWARD?

St. Luke's Foundation's **Patient Care Excellence Award Program** recognizes healthcare providers who demonstrate outstanding achievement in their chosen field. Award nominees are nominated by their peers, manager and/or director through a nomination process held annually in each department. Each nominee is then asked to complete an application and write an essay for consideration. The Foundation's Award Selection Committee determines the Award Recipients.

This program was established by several supporters of St. Luke's Hospital to recognize caregivers (nurses, social workers, therapists, etc). These individuals generously donated to the Foundation so a caregiver would be given financial assistance to use for educational purposes or any other intent of the donor. Through the collaboration of Foundation and Hospital staff the donor created specific criteria for the Award.

An example of this is Ron Mahany and his family. Ron, who battled cancer, set up a memorial fund at St. Luke's Foundation in appreciation of all the care and encouragement he received from his team in St. Luke's Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation. Ron wanted this endowment to support the rehab department with career development, scholarships and physical therapy equipment. After Ron passed, his family and friends continued to support this endowment fund and over time, the **Ron Mahany Award** was created. Through this Award several therapists have attended national conferences and brought back to St. Luke's new ideas and evidence-based practices.

WHAT'S A SCHOLARSHIP?

St. Luke's Foundation's **Scholarship Program** provides St. Luke's Team Members with financial assistance who are working towards a post-secondary degree at an accredited college or university. All Scholarship Recipients must complete a scholarship application and write an essay to be eligible for a scholarship. The Foundation's Selection Committee determines the scholarship recipients.

Funding for these scholarships is provided through individual donors who have established a fund at the Foundation for this purpose. The intent is for the scholarship recipient to use his/her degree to advance the care for our patients.
