What We Do

Dietitian Services

Nutrition is a key component to optimizing a child's growth, development, therapeutic outcomes and overall healthy immune system. The registered dietitian collaborates with the child's family, therapists and healthcare provider to develop a nutrition plan to meet these needs. In addition, the dietitian and our feeding team specialize in developing and supporting the implementation of blenderized diets for children who receive their nutrition through a gastrostomy tube.

Occupational Therapy


Occupational therapists help children succeed with activities of daily living including feeding, dressing, writing and playing. Occupational therapists identify and treat problems in development or sensory processing that may interfere with these skills.

Physical Therapy

Physical therapists work with children to help them develop the skills they need to crawl, walk, run and play with their friends. Physical therapists evaluate and treat problems in development, coordination, strength or balance that might make these activities difficult.

Speech and Language Therapy

Speech-language pathologists help children understand what is being said to them and express their needs, thoughts and ideas. Speech-language pathologists assess all aspects of communication such as understanding/ comprehension, pronouncing sounds, voice problems and stuttering.
