When will I see the Neonatal Nurse Practitioner (NNP)?

There is a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner (NNP) or Resident Physician in the hospital 24/7. Either a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner (NNP) or Resident Physician will be assigned to care for your child alongside the Neonatologist. Daily rounding will be done for each child. During daily rounding the Neonatal Nurse Practitioner (NNP) and Resident Physician will discuss your child's care with you, as well as with the Neonatologist and other medical specialists.

You may see one or more of our neonatal nurse practitioners during your stay. They all work together to provide the best care possible while you are here.
