

Prospective Volunteer,

Thank you for your interest in volunteering at UnityPoint Health – Des Moines! Volunteers are important members of our organization, helping to provide an exceptional experience for patients and visitors. As a member of the UnityPoint Health – Des Moines team, all volunteers are required to complete a health screening and proof of vaccinations prior to beginning in any volunteer role.

The following immunizations/vaccinations are required* of all UnityPoint Health volunteers and team members:

- Influenza: Annually, or an approved exemption
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR): Two doses of MMR vaccine or laboratory evidence of immunity
- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap): One dose of Tdap vaccine in past 10 years
- Varicella: Two doses of Varicella vaccine or laboratory evidence of immunity

Strongly recommended immunizations/vaccinations:

- COVID-19
- Hepatitis B

Additionally, all new volunteers and team members are required to undergo a tuberculosis screening, risk assessment, and tuberculosis test (at no cost to the volunteer or team member).

Healthcare worker (HCW) as defined by the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC): All paid and unpaid persons working in healthcare settings who have the potential for exposure to patients and/or to infectious materials, including body substances, contaminated medical supplies and equipment, contaminated environmental surfaces, or contaminated air. HCW might include (but are not limited to): physicians, nurses, nursing assistants, therapists, technicians, emergency medical service personnel, dental personnel, pharmacists, laboratory personnel, autopsy personnel, students and trainees, contractual staff not employed by the health-care facility, and persons, e.g., clerical, dietary, housekeeping, laundry, security, maintenance, administrative, billing, and volunteers) not directly involved in patient care but potentially exposed to infectious agents that can be transmitted to and from HCW and patients.
