Friends,

As I reflect on 2022 so far, I think about the amazing donors and team members I've met here at UnityPoint Health® - Grinnell Regional Medical Center (GRMC), the incredible ways you invest in GRMC, and how your support helps us fulfill our mission of improving the health of the people and communities we serve.

But the year is not over yet. Right now, the GRMC Foundation is wrapping up the annual Employee Giving Campaign and kicking off the Fall Annual Fund Drive appeal, while making plans for the coming year.

I want to take this opportunity to share with you about the importance of gifts to our endowments. As you may know, GRMC has three endowments, two of which are managed by the Greater Poweshiek Community Foundation. The third one is overseen by the GRMC Foundation Board of Directors.

Endowment giving is an investment in the future of the hospital. Gifts designated to GRMC's endowments are added to the endowment's principle and then invested. Only a portion of the interest earned each year can be used as needed. Once invested, an endowment gift becomes the *gift that keeps on giving*.

For example, you may have recently read the press release about the GRMC Foundation's donation of \$13,511.80 to Capstone Behavioral Healthcare. This donation is the combined 2021 and 2022 annual spendable distributions from the Grinnell Regional Mental Health Endowment – a portion of the interest earned on the endowment's invested principle. Capstone is a trusted and valued partner in meeting the mental health needs in our communities and the GRMC Foundation is pleased to support them in their efforts to ensure timely access to compassionate mental health care.

The impact of gifts to our endowments is significant and GRMC's gratitude for these gifts is immeasurable. My thanks go out to the donors who have given to these three endowments and to all our supporters who partner with GRMC in fulfilling our mission.

Tax-Wise Charitable Planning Strategies

A number of charitable planning strategies can help you lower your income and taxes this year. Here are three ways you can shift tax dollars to charitable dollars and support a cause like ours.

- ✓ IRA Charitable Rollover
 Persons of age 70½ or older
 can rollover up to \$100,000
 from their IRA to a qualified
 charity like ours. This may
 lower your income and taxes.
- Outright Gift of an Asset
 Make a gift of stock, real
 estate, grain or another asset,
 avoid paying capital gains tax
 on the transfer and receive a
 tax-saving charitable
 deduction.
- Donor Advised Fund (DAF) Make a tax-deductible gift to a DAF, which gives you the ability to make grants to your favorite charities this year and in future years.
