# Your 2022 Impact

At John Stoddard Cancer Center, we know a cancer diagnosis is a big part of someone's life yet, it isn't their entire life. This is why, in addition to providing the best clinical treatment possible, the team at Stoddard also provides programs and services to support patients - and their loved ones - throughout their cancer journey and beyond to help them live their best lives possible. Thanks to you, John Stoddard Cancer Center continues to meet the unique health care needs of cancer patients throughout Des Moines and lowa. **Donors helped:** 

- For five years, The Charlie Cutler Healing & Wellness Program has grown to include mindfulness based stress reduction, massage therapy, music therapy and aromatherapy. In addition to adding the Meals That Matter Program, which gave away more than 6,000 meals last year, Meals That Matter at Home was also launched and provides virtual cooking classes and recipes along with a box of fruits and vegetables delivered to patients at home at no cost.
- Installed the Halcyon Linear
  Accelerator. The first-of-its-kind in the
  state of lowa, the Halcyon delivers
  radiation therapy up to four times
  faster than other machines. Like the
  other treatment machines at John
  Stoddard Cancer Center, the Halcyon
  is equipped with the most advanced
  image guidance system, AlignRT,
  allowing treatment to be extremely
  precise.
- Our radiation oncologists became the first in the state to offer a new treatment called Pluvicto (apart from a clinical trial) and were the first in Central lowa to offer Lutathera. Both drugs are new infusion therapies to treat specific types of cancer. Having these treatments closer to home makes this groundbreaking treatment available to more of our patients.
- Our community education and outreach efforts continued through free cancer screening events, and the Dish with Nish podcast featuring topics of interest in cancer prevention and care. We established a partnership with the organization Black Women 4 Healthy Living and resumed our presence at events, like lowa State Fair, and community health fairs.

# Looking to the Future

This coming year will expand the comfort and care at John Stoddard Cancer Center and continue to celebrate the lasting impact your philanthropic support provides.

Through the **It Takes You** Campaign, a Next Generation Sequencing (NGS) machine will be purchased, allowing Stoddard to rapidly analyze tumors for genetic variations for precise drug targeting. The capital improvements will also include a new High Dose Radiation (HDR) machine, which delivers higher, more targeted doses of radiation to tumors minimizing damage to healthy tissue.

Stoddard Cancer Center will also replace a second linear accelerator with a brand-new TrueBeam.

Dr. Crosby Rock will join our radiation oncology team in August 2023.

The Adolescent and Young Adult Program will celebrate its 10th year at Stoddard Cancer Center. Since 2013, more than 435 patients have utilized this program throughout their treatment.

The Charlie Cutler Healing & Wellness Program will continue to expand to include outpatient massage therapy and acupuncture services.

A Financial Navigator will be added to the Oncology Navigation team to better meet the needs of our patients and reduce financial barriers to care.
